Man in court for having indecent images

A Southwold man who took a photograph up the skirt of a 14-year-old girl was also found to have indecent images of children on his computer following his arrest, a court has heard.

Peter Norval was identified from CCTV footage at a store in Southwold where he was seen to put his camera phone up the

schoolgirl's skirt, Ipswich Crown Court was told.

Michael Crimp, prosecuting, said a friend of the girl saw what happened and heard the phone click as the picture was taken.

Police officers seized his laptop and an iPad and found a small number of indecent images.

Norval, 53, of Victoria Street, Southwold, admitted two offences of making indecent images of children and one offence of outraging public decency on February 1 by taking the photograph up the girl's skirt.

The case was adjourned to allow the judge to assess the photos.
